Visiting faculty will be expected to prepare a research manuscript for the UW Center for Demography and Ecology (CDE) Working Paper Series and deliver a research presentation to the APL, CDE and Department of Community and Environmental Sociology that is based on the project. Applicants should demonstrate excellence and productivity in research, and a commitment to collaborative work with APL staff.

- The duration will be one to two semesters; no renewal for any one professor.
- Compensation in the form of a stipend up to \$15,000 will be made available, as will round-trip travel between Madison and the faculty's home institution. Visiting faculty will be given access to the UW libraries and other resources standard for visiting faculty, office space, and computing resources.
- The intent of this position is to enhance the research activities of visiting faculty, and to foster ongoing research activity between APL academic staff and a diverse set of active scholars.
